ACHNE and APHN have a long history of collaboration focusing on mutual topics of interest that strengthen each organization's mission. Simply put, we recognize we are Stronger Together. To that end, we are pleased to announce the objectives for the 2023 ACHNE APHN Joint Conference and open the Call for Abstracts!

**Purpose:** To provide a scholarly and supportive meeting ground for Community/Public/Population Health Nursing Leaders – both educators and practitioners – committed to excellence in community, population, and public health nursing; To Advance population health by bridging Community/Public/Population Nursing practice, education, research, policy, and leadership together.

## Objectives:

- Identify and build upon emerging opportunities for **academic-practice partnerships** to transform PHN practice for the 21<sup>st</sup> century;
- Highlight new insights supporting **innovation in PHN** practice, education, scholarship, and policy to advance health equity;
- Identify and build **interprofessional scholarship** interests between PHN educators and practitioners;
- Explore emerging trends in **PHN preparedness** for and response to public health emergencies and disasters;
- Describe collaborative approaches supporting PHN transition **from training to practice**;
- Explore strategies to support the **recruitment, retention, and resilience** of a diverse PHN workforce;
- Explore approaches to **increase capacity of the PHN workforce** to assure foundational public health services and capabilities;
- Explore methods to demonstrate the **value of PHNs** (e.g. establish nurse sensitive indicators for community/public/population health nursing);
- Identify **experiential and educational preparation** for faculty teaching clinical and didactic components of the AACN competencies focused on community/public/population health nursing at the basic and advanced levels.

**Members of all levels from both ACHNE & APHN are invited to submit your abstract here.**

*The Deadline to submit your abstract is December 5 2022. Abstract submitters will be notified of decisions by January 13 2023. Visit [www.ACHNE.org/institute](http://www.ACHNE.org/institute) for more information.*

Complete and submit **one submission per presentation. Please indicate your preference for a podium presentation, plenary presentation, or poster presentation.** Please assure abstract is submitted completely, indicated by a completion message and abstract submission summary email immediately following the submission.

**The submitter will receive a confirmation of receipt.** Once submitted, revisions to abstracts cannot be accepted. Late submissions will not be accepted. **\*Communications will be directed to the submitter only.**

Required components:

1. Presentation title
2. Lead presenter and abstract contact name, credentials, job title or role (e.g., student), organization, address, phone number, email, (\*All communication about the abstract will be sent only to the lead presenter).
3. Additional presenters, job title or role (e.g., student), organization, address, phone number and email (up to 5 additional presenters)
4. Short biographical sketches for each presenter
5. Resume or CV is required for all presenters
6. Conflict of Interest fields completed for all presenters
7. Preferred session format (podium, plenary, or ePoster)
8. Learning outcomes (up to 5), using ANCC's revised Bloom's Taxonomy (see table below)
9. Abstract text should include these components (500 word maximum)
  - a) Background
  - b) Purpose
  - c) Methods
  - d) Results
  - e) Conclusions
  - f) Implications/relevance for public health
10. Brief description of session or poster that will appeal to attendees and may be used for the conference program (no more than 50 words)
11. Target audience (what type of professional would be most interested in your session/poster)
12. Level of session/poster (beginning, intermediate, advanced)
13. Audio/visual needs (all rooms will have a screen and projector)
14. Special accommodations needed for presenters
15. Electronic signature of abstract submitter. This serves as the electronic signature and signifies the intent to comply with all the requirements of the Association of Public Health Nurses.

You will be notified if there is any missing information in your submission.

If accepted for podium presentation, ACHNE and APHN will request your PowerPoint a few weeks prior to the conference.

If your abstract is accepted for poster presentation, you will need to attend the poster sessions.

**All presenters are required to register in advance for the 2023 Joint Conference.**
